

The October Worcester-Schenevus Library Board of Trustees meeting was held on October 8th, 2025.

Diane Addesso, President of the Board of Trustees, called the meeting to order at 5:28 p.m. In attendance, Trustees Christy Deitchman, Chris Boyle, John Tazuel, Barb Hamil, and Chriss Odell were present as was Library Director, Anne Nassar. Jo-Ann Scheiner was not present.

Minutes – A motion (1st by Boyle, 2nd by Hamil) to accept the Minutes of the September 10th, 2025 Trustees Meeting, was approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report – Restricted grants are now listed on the financials in a separate category to make it easier to keep track. Money from Worcester Central School has been received.

A motion (1st by Hamil, 2nd by Boyle) to approve the financial disbursements for the month, was approved unanimously.

Director's Report – Brief discussion regarding family visitation sessions at the Library. Diane has talked to Steve Bachman and the Supervisor regarding the visits. Diane will reach out again to the Supervisor to ask for a meeting to discuss appropriate behavior and to make sure that the rules are followed while using the Library. There was another incident in the exercise class in August, but the incident report has yet to be received. Anne has applied for a Libraries Transforming Communities Grant and, if awarded, will be used to pay for fiction and non-fiction books about Autism. The PTO monthly meeting is taking place at the Library.

Old/New Business - Still no news on 4County grant. Trustee terms of John Tazuel and Barb Hamil expire soon and the Board will vote next month. Tree was taken down at Strawberry Hall. Will submit Robinson Broadhurst grant, due 11/30/2025, to remove three other trees and to have new trees planted.

A motion (1st by Boyle, 2nd by Hamil) to adjourn, carried unanimously. President Addesso adjourned the meeting at 6:06 p.m.

The President set the next Trustees meeting for Wednesday, November 12th, 2025 at 5:30pm at the Library. The public is welcome to attend.
